
2015 PLAYWRIGHT MASTER CLASS

Athol Fugard says that playwriting is a craft: The playwright builds plays as a shipwright builds ships. Fugard likens creating a play to making a table – all four legs need to be solid so that the piece stands firmly on its own.



This 2015 Playwright Master Class will focus on the *craft of playwriting*, sharing timetested techniques for creating solid structure, drama, character and dialogue. Through the course, students will master four essential pillars on which to build any great play.

COURSE DESIGN

Introductory Session:

- The seven elements of great storytelling
- A common language: Acts, Scenes, Beats
- Introduction to the four techniques of playwriting

Session One: Structure

- The power of genre (choose wisely!)
- The essence of Three-Act Structure and the Five-Act variant

Session Three: Character

- Character crosses: Creating threedimensional characters
- The drama triangle and how to generate life

Session Two: Drama

- The essentials of protagonists and antagonists
- The essence (and necessity) of external and internal drama

Session Four: Dialogue

- The four key types of dialogue
- Breaking the Fourth Wall
- Great dialogue: Secret messages

Ongoing Throughout: Exercises to practice writing dangerously and writing the truth.


Schedule: Introductory Meeting (6-9:00 pm): Wednesday, **21 January**

Alex Burger is a playwright, screenwriter, and teacher with a professional background in issues of poverty and race. His newest play will premiere in 2015 staring Dorothy Anne Gould and Keketso Semoko. His play *Whose Blood* played to a fully sold-out run in London in 2011 and he won the 2010 Harvardwood award for his one-act play *Three-Fifths*. Alex is currently developing television content for Quizzical Pictures and is in discussion with Hollywood producers on a film and television project.

Alex teaches writing and Wits University and the Market Theatre Laboratory and is a judge for the South African Naledi Awards. Alex is a U.S. national who now makes Johannesburg his home. He is a former Vice President at AngloGold Ashanti. He holds an A.B. from Harvard University and an M.B.A. from INSEAD.
